 - B. Farming Report- Peter provided the following updates:
 - 1. All pre-emergent sprays have been completed.
 - 2. The Lugonia grove may be picked soon, but the market is very slow right now.
 - 3. The remaining Navels are small size and it may be tough to find a market this year.
 - 3. Sunkist will be issuing the largest ever refunds to growers for the past season.
 - C. Quality of Life Staff Report –Erik provided the following updates:
 - 1. It looks like only portions of two rows of trees needed to be removed at Lugonia.
 - 2. Not too many issues in most grove locations this month due to all the rain.

- D. Individual Commissioner Reports:
 - 1. The groves are too wet right now to access.
 - 2. Jack mentioned that his rain gauges indicate almost 18' of rain for the season locally.
- E. 10 Year Citrus Plan:
- 1. A review of the last seven calendar years' (2012-2018) worth of pack-out summary highlights were discussed, including:
 - 1). The gross receipts for 2018 were approx. \$ 885,000, the 2nd best year in the last seven.
- 2). The net return per carton/fb was below average for 5 of 7 years for the Texas Navels, 7 of 7 years for the Texas Val's, 5 of 7 years for the Prospect Park Navels, and 3 of 4 years for the Palmetto Val'.

 - 1. Partially discussed in 4 E above, but City Staff was unable to produce the financial reports promised last month for the March meeting, so the discussion will be continued to the next meeting.
