1. Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 4:05 pm by Chairman Day.

2. Public Comments: None

3. Approval of Minutes:

A. The minutes of the December 10, 2019, meeting was approved as written. M/S/P.

- 4. Status Reports:
 - A. Packing House Report Roy provided the following updates:
 - 1. VPOA starting harvesting the early Navels.
 - 2. The sizes are running on the small size (88's 113's).
 - 3. The FOB prices are running \$10-12 per carton right now.
 - 4. Roy provided a handout on the 2018/19 pack out figures.
 - B. Farming Report- Chuck provided the following updates:
 - 1. The outlook for a good return on the Navels is not looking good right now; Bin prices are low.
 - 2. Chuck expressed concern that the market is moving away from Valencia's; He suggested that the CPC look at re-planting certain groves with late season Navels.
 - 3. The fertilization and pre-emergent sprays are complete.

- C. Quality of Life Staff Report –Erik, Zach and Tim provided the following updates:
- 1. The irrigation lines at the Gateway grove have been relocated due to the ongoing rail project.
 - 2. The hedges have been removed from the University grove location.
- 3. The bids are out for re-planting Texas and Palmetto and they are due back by the end of the month.
 - 4. There are early discussions about adding a cell tower in the grove near the landfill.
- D. Individual Commissioner Reports:
 - 1. Jack commented that the fruit color is improving, but still slow; Fruit sizes are still small.
- 2. Kyle commented that fruit picking is slow as the groves need to be treated for ACP prior to harvest.
- E. 10 Year Citrus Plan:
- 1. City staff was asked to update the financial spreadsheets with the 2018/19 data just provided by VPOA and bring the issue back for discussion at the February meeting.
- 5. Old Business:
 - A. Re-planting the lower 11 acres at Prospect Park:
 - 1. Michael deferred discussion until a later date but asked City staff to keep the item on the agenda.
 - B. Re-planting Texas and Palmetto groves:
 - 1. See 4, C, 3 above.
 - C. Discussion and possible action on ACP education for residents:
 - 1. Heather provided samples of the variety of outreach materials available thru the PR firm (NST) for the citrus community.
 - 2. City staff will check on the costs to insert two "1/3" flyers.
 - D. Planting at Palmetto, east of the landfill:
 - 1. The topic will be discussed at the City Council meeting on February 18, 2020.
