## Citrus Preservation Commission – Meeting Minutes

Minutes of the regular meeting of the City of Redlands Citrus Preservation Commission held on Tuesday, October 10, 2017, at 4:00 pm in the Municipal Utilities and Engineering Department Conference Room, 35 Cajon Street, Suite 15-A, Redlands, are as follows:

1. Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 4:01 pm by Chairman Buoye.

## 2. Public Comments:

- A. Linda Richards, a local resident and science writer, made a few comments on the need to use more beneficial insects for ACP. The three points she wanted to emphasize were as follows:
  - 1. The use of Hover flies should be encouraged in organic groves.
  - 2. More native plants should be used in residential plantings.
  - 3. The use of pesticides in commercial groves should be reduced.

## 3. Approval of Minutes:

A. The minutes of September 12, 2017, meeting was approved as written. M/S/P.

## 4. New Business:

- A. Packing House Report Roy (CCC):
- 1. Roy distributed a handout that summarized the pack out, net return per field box, the net return, and the utilization rate for the Valencia, Navel, and GF crops for the last three years.
- 2. Hurricane Irma destroyed 75-80 % of the Orange crop in Florida, which should help the local Valencia market.
- B. Farming Report- Chuck provided the following updates:

- 1. Most of the current work is focused on weeds and watering.
- 2. The Gibb spraying will start this week.
- 3. The GAP certification process is currently underway. The City PD and Caltrans just finished cleaning the I-10 grove earlier in the day. The Prospect Park and Palmetto groves will not be GAP certified.
  - 4. The bids for the filters next to the planned development site will be addressed next spring.
- C. Individual Commissioner Reports:
  - 1. The fruit is coloring up nicely, with good size.
- D. 10 Year Citrus Plan:
- 1. The spreadsheets distributed at the last meeting will be finalized with minimal changes and will be discussed further at the next meeting.
- 5. Old Business:
  - A. CPC Planting Guidelines:
  - 1. Discussion on the guidelines was postponed until next month so that relevant City staff could be in attendance.
  - B. Fencing Update:
  - 1. The bids for the Riverview and West Redlands Gateway groves were received earlier in the day. The bids for Riverview ranged from a low of 19K to a high of 80K. Work should begin soon. The bids for the West Redlands Gateway ranged from a low of 30K to a high of 75K. However, the site is still undergoing design review with Caltrans.
- 6. New Business:
  - A. Citrus Pest Control District Petition:
    - 1. The City Council agreed to vote in favor of forming a local PCD.
  - B. Update on Citrus revenue YTD:
    - 1. Roy will send a block by block summary to the City next week.
  - C. Planting Recommendation for New Development near the Judson Grove:

- 1. The plans call for planting Cara Cara Navels. Approximately 655 trees will be planted on 4.8 acres and a few minor adjacent areas.
- 7. Future agenda items for consideration:
  - A. Update on the citrus pool revenue for year to date.
  - B. Planting Guidelines review with City Department staff.
- 8. Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned at 4:55 pm.
- 9. The Next Meeting date will be November 14, 2017.
