Woodspring Suites Hotel with 123 guest rooms, a total of 48,224 square feet and four stories high, located at 1700 Orange Tree Lane has completed construction and is now open.



Esri Building 'E', three stories high and a total of 110,549 square feet for administrative/professional office space, is currently under construction at 1107 West Park Ave.



Packinghouse District Shopping Center Phase 2, consisting of two new buildings totaling 15,250 square feet plus outdoor patios for retail or restaurant uses, is currently under

New life on the horizon for Redlands landfill

The California Street Landfill is owned and operated by the City of Redlands. The City maintains overall responsibility for landfill administration, engineering, design, construction, operations, and environmental monitoring. The County of San Bernardino began waste disposal operations at the site in 1963. In 1970, the City took possession of the site and continued waste disposal operation.

In 2017, the City Council adopted a new solid waste rate structure, which included funding designated for capital improvement projects and the purchase of more efficient landfill equipment. Many routine alterations and additions to the landfill infrastructure and equipment have occurred over the course of City ownership of the landfill; however, the recent rate adjustment

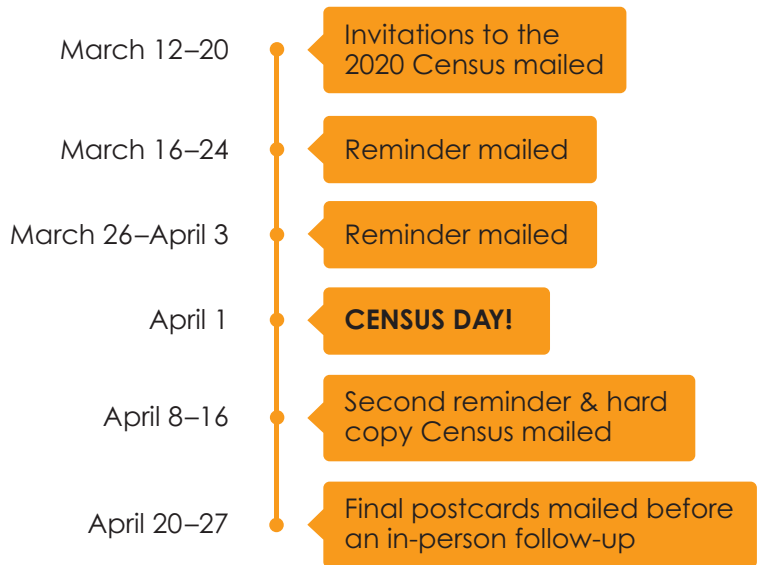

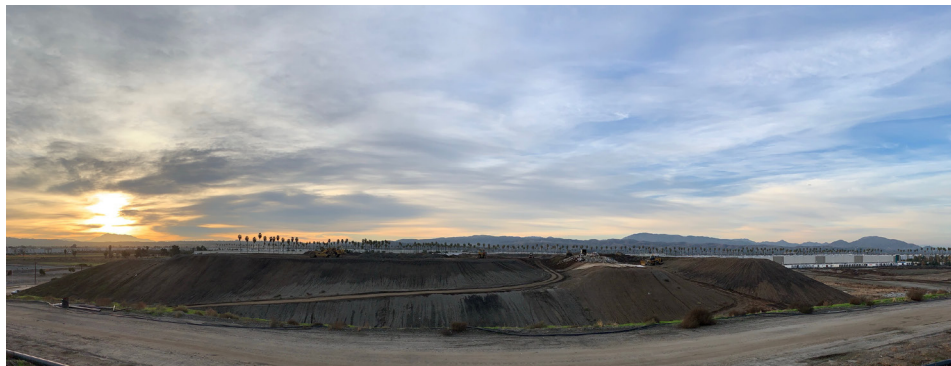

provided the most significant positive impact on the landfill of the last 25 years.

Landfill airspace, the amount of remaining space available for waste, is limited by size of the site and its design. The more waste that is received, the faster that airspace is consumed.

Proactive measures by the City to improve the life expectancy of the landfill, including equipment upgrades and operational changes, have increased the usable capacity of the landfill by 42 percent, saved approximately \$8.5 million in avoid-

ed soil purchase import costs over the life of the landfill, and provided an annual savings in equipment and operator costs of \$63,000 annually. In 2012, the City received a report indicating that the landfill would reach its capacity in the year 2042. With the recent improvements, the life of the landfill has been extended another 11 years to 2053.

Improvements to the California Street Landfill ensure that this valuable asset will continue to serve the residents of Redlands for many more years.
